Garden tasks for April gardening in this mild weather area include watering, feeding, and generally tending to perennials that made it through the winter months. Given that the area falls in the higher plant hardiness zones, many of the plants in your yard might be perennials. For these mature plants, you need to meet their immediate needs. Irrigating is important during dry periods since many of the deciduous plants have

started their spring growth. Going without water can kill the new shoots. You'll also want to fertilize plants like roses, berries, citrus trees, and deciduous fruit trees. **You'll want to weed early and often too.**

FYI from the Davis Stirling Act: What happens if you do not pay your assessments? Usually, the association will send you a reminder letter as a first step. The law is specific in California regarding the due date of assessments and the overall process that an association must follow regarding delinquent assessments. The law states that if an assessment is not paid within 15 days of the due date, a delinquency occurs. At this point, the association can add a charge to your assessment in the form of a late fee. If you still fail to pay your assessments, the matter may be referred to an attorney or foreclosure service. The association has the right to lien your property for the amounts owed as well as other costs such as attorney's fees.

Ultimately, the association can foreclose and take your property for your failure to pay assessments. A personal judgment may also be entered against you.

As you can see, it is imperative that all owners pay their assessments in a timely manner.

The Chair called the regularly scheduled meeting to order at 7:00 P.M., Thursday, April 14, 2022. Three Board members were present and a quorum was established. Leuren Aenburg and Margaret Wielenga were not present.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chair's Report: The quarterly report spread sheet is still being worked on. The component inventory addendum was presented and gone over. A new landscape company has been retained, PJD Landscaping. Their fees are less than TM and they are doing more. Clubhouse door has been refurbished. New roofs will be put on the sheds outside the clubhouse soon.

The Pool and spa are opened. The pump for the spa was repaired recently, and a new first aid kit was put in the kitchen in the clubhouse.

Treasurer's Report: All taxes have been accomplished. There is a \$50,000 CD due in August, we are hoping interest rates go up by then.

2nd Vice Chair Report: Jeff reported that he met with our new landscapers to see how we can save water by watering some areas less. There has been some graffiti on the wall on the College side that has been cleaned up. We have had instances where the front gate has been hit and caused minimal damage. The mail boxes in Quail Meadows East have been vandalized so we are suggesting you do not put mail in the outgoing slots at night. We are looking into the cost of planting some Pyracantha bushes along the chain link fence on the Santa Maria side for privacy. Looking to put in plants in the guest parking area on Pheasant View. Upgrading areas around mail boxes, and replacing the two mailboxes that don't have outgoing slots.

Secretary's Report: One letter was sent to a homeowner who has not been paying their HOA fees.

Architectural Report: Marci presented to the board that there have been 15 requests for approval of home improvements in the last three months and sever al letters sent out for appearance corrections which more than half have been corrected.

Keith was not present but Michael informed us that advertising income is up and the new directory did go out.

Old/New Business: We have funds for our social club, we just need someone to volunteer to start it back up. We would like to have our 4th of July BBQ, just need volunteers to help.

We will be having our Community Yard Sale on Saturday, June 11th, Tracy has volunteered to do signs and advertising. No tables will be available from the clubhouse.

A question was brought up about the cameras in the pool area and was addressed.

Next meeting will be July 14 at 7:00 P.M.



RECIPE OF THE MONTH



Brown Sugar BBQ Chicken

YIELDS:	PREP TIME:	TOTAL TIME:
6 SERVINGS	0 HOURS 10 MINS	4 HOURS 15 MINS

INGREDIENTS

- 2 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 c. barbecue sauce, plus more for serving
- 1/2 c. packed light or brown sugar
- 1/4 c. bourbon
- 1/4 c. Italian dressing
- 2 tsp. garlic powder
- 1 tsp. paprika
- Kosher salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 6 potato buns
- Coleslaw, for serving

DIRECTIONS

- 1. In a slow-cooker, combine chicken breasts, barbecue sauce, brown sugar, bourbon, Italian dressing, garlic powder and paprika. Season with salt and pepper.
- 2. Toss until well coated, then cover and cook on high for 4 hours or on low for 6 hours.
- 3. Shred chicken and serve on buns with a drizzle of barbecue sauce and a spoonful of coleslaw.
